

General Regulations

1. HORSES and CATTLE: €8.00 per single animal.
2. SHEEP and GOATS: €3.00 per single animal.
3. FLOWERS, VEGETABLES, BUTTER, EGGS, FRUIT, etc. €1.50 per single entry.
4. **NO FREE ADMISSION TO SHOW WITH EXHIBITS. ALL ENTRY FEES must accompany entries to all Sections and must reach the Secretary on or before 26th June 2010. Entry fees are non refundable.**
NO EXHIBITS SHALL COMPETE IN MORE THAN ONE SECTION OR CLASS EXCEPT FOR SPECIAL PRIZES OR CHAMPIONSHIPS OR ALL-IRELAND CHAMPIONSHIPS.
5. Extra Entry Forms may be had from the Secretary or from our website
www.inishowenagriculturalshow.com
6. OBJECTIONS must be made in writing, signed by the objector, and lodged with the Secretary on or before the third day after the Show, €10.00 deposit.
7. All exhibits must be in the Show Field not later than 9.30am on the morning of the Show and must not be removed from the Field before 4.00 pm.
N.B. Exhibitors are requested to notice that Saturday 26th June is absolutely the last day on which entries can be received for the Show.
8. All animals in Cattle Classes must be led and kept under proper control d. N.B. Animals not under proper control will not be judged.
9. Judging will commence promptly at 10 am
10. Important Notice to Animal Owners involved in Showing Animals: The Irish Shows Association would advise all animal owners who have their animals Insured to have the Insurance cover extended to cover them while showing Animals at Shows. We understand that it cost very little or nothing at all depending on who you have Insurance cover with. If you are one of the few who don't have cover we would advise that you think about putting it in place for this purpose it may be well worthwhile. The reason for us giving you this advice is to protect yourself in the event of your animal lashing out, and injuring someone or damaging someone's property, if that were to happen, and it is established that your animal was out of your control you may be held responsible, or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused and may end up paying all, or part of any settlement reached.

General Conditions and Rules governing the All-Ireland Championships

The following conditions apply to all the sponsored Championships which are organised and administered by the Irish Shows Assoc.

1. Eligibility - entry to participate in the Championships is confined to shows which have paid the 5% championship administration fund 2009.
2. Qualifying rounds will take place at shows designated by the Irish Shows Association.
3. Selected Shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals would qualify.
4. Animals that have already qualified are not eligible to compete in further qualifiers at local shows in the same Championship.
5. Shows may charge an entry fee for each "qualifier" class and I.S.A. will award a rosette to a selected animal.
6. It is a condition that no other sponsor may be involved in "qualifier" classes.
7. These general rules and those relating to the individual Championships being staged should be published in the schedule and catalogue of the participating Show.
8. On completion of judging the successful competitors must attend the secretary's office within 2 hrs. and the Secretary of the Show or the representative present from the Irish Shows Association will arrange to take the following particulars in respect of each qualifier at the Show: (Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals/exhibits for the final through the show secretary as stated above)
 - (a) Name and address of the winner and full particulars of the qualifying animal.
 - (b) Notify the winner of each qualifier of the date and place of the final and collect the appropriate fee for same.
9. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
10. The Irish Shows Association in consultation with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of a competition as may be necessary.
11. 5% of the prize money will be retained by the Irish Shows Association towards the cost of running the Championships.
12. Any competitor in breach of these rules will be disqualified from competing in these Championships.
13. Shows and competitors must contact the I.S.A. for details and concerning these Championships and not the sponsors.
14. Any objections or complaints must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. Representative at the Show and the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of the competition together with €50 or other stated fee which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.

In the interest of Safety, all Bovine and Equine animals in the I.S.A. organised Championships must be led by competent adults

PEOPLE TO WHOM Perpetual Cups are presented shall give security to the Society that these Cups will be delivered to the Chairperson, Secretary or the treasurer of the show, in as good a condition as they were received , on the first Monday of June the following year.

MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS TO AND FROM SHOWS

You should apply in good time to the Show Secretary to check any requirements specific to the show you wish to attend.

Animal Health Status

1. T. B.

All animals must come from herds which are not restricted, and the herd and relevant animals must have had a clear test within the previous twelve months.

No pre-movement test is required for T.B. However, it is recommended by the Department that a 30 day premovement test for TB should apply to all Shows.

2. Brucellosis

(a) All animals must come from herds which are not restricted.

(b) Certain animals (i.e. females aged 18 months and over and bulls aged 24 months and over) must have passed a test for Brucellosis within the previous 60 days. However, these animals may move to any number of Shows within the validity period of the same 60-day premovement test.

Where such an animal(s) is/are being shown repeatedly during successive 60-day validity periods, in the course of a Show season, the animal(s) may be allowed to move on foot of Permit ER 36A during the unexpired portion of a valid test where the animal is under test for the next validity period and the identity card/passport is held by the D.V.O. /practitioner.

3. Identification.

All cattle must bear double plastic tags as issued under the Department's identification system and must be accompanied by their passports.

4. CMMS Notification

The movement of cattle to and from the Show must be recorded on CMMS using form CMMS 4 (forms available from your local DVO).

The keeper of the animal(s) should complete sections 2, 3(a) and 4(a) of the CMMS 4 form. The Show Secretary should complete sections 3(b) and 4(b) and completed forms should be sent to the Cattle Movement Notification Agency within 7 days of movement in the pre-paid envelope supplied.
